

## NT History Museum, Riviera Theater present folk music



The North Tonawanda History Museum is offering advance sale tickets for its Feb. 17 Simple Gifts concert in the historic Riviera Theater. The concert will include a free post-concert workshop about the instruments, "Meet the Artists & Instruments." This workshop will give audience members the opportunity to talk one-on-one with the musicians, see their instruments up close, and ask questions. They draw on an impressive variety of ethnic folk styles, combining tradition with innovation.
